Global and specific objectives

Global objective:

The aim of this technical assistance is to build the capacity of local stakeholders (including women and indigenous peoples) on the VPA, in view of achieving its successful implementation in Guyana, and in keeping with the EU FLEGT's principles of inclusivity, and the EU and Guyana Government's commitment to sustainable forest management.

- Specific objective(s) -
- To provide institutional strengthening and training for Guyana Timber Legality Assurance System (GTLAS) agencies, including to capture and archive relevant information for the VPA
- To provide capacity building/training to Forest Sector Operators (FSOs) in those areas which will allow for greater GTLAS compliance, such as fiscal and environmental requirements as captured in the VPA Legality Definition (LD).
- To conduct studies which will help understand existing gaps and subsequently support VPA implementation by ensuring that all stakeholders are fairly treated and included in the VPA implementation.



GTLAS Members

The GTLAS is based on the national legal framework and aims to ensure that Guyana's timber products are legal.

- The team of experts will review capacity gas assessments of the different stakeholders to implement the VPA. This will help to develop targeted training programs that seek to address the gaps identified from the needs assessment. Completed.
- The team leader will prepare the inception report summarizing the objectives, methodology, approach, scope and outputs of the assignment, documentation review, field missions, findings, and setting out a detailed planning of the project's activities, including the work program. Completed.
- In order to conclude the inception phase of the assignment, the inception report and the complete logistical organization for the trainings and studies will be presented to the JMRC and EC team for feedback and finalization. Mostly completed.



Phase 2: Field (Guyana)

- Most of the training activities will be carried out at the Forestry Training Centre Inc. (FTCI).

 Forest operators, Amerindian Reservation, Associations in the interior of the country in the following locations:
 - Aishalton (Region 9); Anna Regina (Region 2); Annai (Region 9); Bartica (Region 7); Georgetown (Region 4); Ituni (Region 10); Karasabai (Region 9); Kwakwani (Region 6); Lethem (Region 9); Linden (Region 10); Mabaruma (Region 1); Moruca (Region 1); New Amsterdam (Region 6); Orealla/Siparuta (Region 6); Parika (Region 3); and Springlands (Region 6).
 - For convenience and costs, locations will be grouped in clusters according to geography.

 - Updated timber grading procedures (Activities 3 and 9)
 - Updated standards for sawmills and lumberyards (Activities 4 and 10)
- How to enable the FTCI to train the number of persons (Government and FSOs) specified in the ToR? For example:

Next steps

- Field studies: Proposed to commence visit to the field from week of 27th November 2023. Team Leader to be accompanied by staff from the FLEGT Secretariat.
- Training:
 - Manuals: DAI to continue to actively engage GFC management, through the FLEGT Secretariat, on timelines for the finalisation and adoption of same.
 - Number of participants: DAI to continue to actively engage GFC management, through the FLEGT Secretariat on the identification of participants and the scheduling of the trainings.
 - FTCI capacity: DAI to continue to engage the FTCI Manager on the logistics for the trainings, paying particular attention to the size of groups and number of days to complete the curriculum for each training activity.
- Time phasing: To be adjusted following the conclusion of all engagements with GFC management, FLEGT Secretariat and FTCI.
